## M.Ed. in Mid. / Sec. Instruction - Online

The M.Ed. in Middle and Secondary Instruction will be offered on-line for post-baccalaureate teachers. The program is designed for educators who are currently teaching and want to enrich their understanding of mid/sec philosophy and organization, young adolescent development, mid/sec level curriculum, and mid/sec level instruction. The Master of Education degree is a 30-hour program, the completion of which results in the earning of a Master of Education degree with specialization in the areas of: English, geosciences, mathematics, social studies (history, political science, psychology, economics, geography, anthropology, sociology).

1. Completed a graduate application
2. Application Fee: \$30 application fee (if not former EUP student); \$7 (if former EUP student)
3. An official transcript verifying an earned baccalaureate degree from an accredited institution.
4. Copy of teaching certificate

OR

Complete a program of study approved by the Dean of Education, leading to certification as a secondary school teacher *prior* to completion of the Master's Degree.

5. Undergraduate QPA of 2.80
6. For students with a QPA below 2.80, scores from the PRAXIS I exams and the Miller Analogies Test (MAT) or the aptitude test of the Graduate Record Examination (GRE), are required. Additional information may be requested after a review of your transcripts.

\* Applicants who are not teacher certified at the time of admission in the graduate program must be eligible for certification in the area of content as part of the master's degree requirements.

**Note:** *Students who are not teacher certified must also successfully complete the PRAXIS exams before a state certification may be awarded. Also, only international students with immigrant status, who submit a form of intent to become a citizen, are eligible to apply for Pennsylvania Department of Education (PDE) certification.*
