UNIVERSITY SINGERS

Edinboro University of Pennsylvania is the largest and most comprehensive institution of higher education in northwestern Pennsylvania. Located in the resort community of Edinboro, the University is only 18 miles from Erie and within 100 miles of the major educational and cultural centers of Buffalo, Cleveland, and Pittsburgh

Edinboro University boasts more than 40 buildings on a spacious, aesthetically-pleasing 585-acre campus that includes a five-acre lake, open fields and wooded areas, multiple residence halls for 2,600 students, and the largest library in northwestern Pennsylvania. The University recently completed Phase I of a \$115 million suite-style residence and dining hall project, and will soon embark on Phase II, with some 800 additional units to be ready for occupancy in 2011. In addition to the new Dr. William P. Alexander Music Center and the vastly expanded Frank G. Pogue Student Center, construction of a new Human Services building and a \$30 million expansion/renovation of the Cooper Hall science building are now underway. Combined, the \$200 million in new construction offers students state-of-the-art facilities that rival the faculty excellence they find in their classrooms. Offering more than 100 degree programs in 24 academic departments, Edinboro University students find success in classrooms, laboratories, studios, performing arts and NCAA athletic venues guided by a faculty and staff of 800 individuals working as one committed team under the leadership of President Jeremy D. Brown

The University also maintains Edinboro University in Erie—the Porreco Center, a pastoral campus that consists of 25 acres and 11 buildings, and Edinboro University in Meadville—The Joseph T. Buba Center, a branch campus 20 miles to the south. All three campuses are connected by free bus service.

The **Department of Music** at Edinboro recently moved into its new, \$5 million William P. Alexander Music Center, a facility specifically designed and constructed to accommodate and promote the needs of music education and performance. Centered around an 84-seat acoustically designed recital hall, the building houses numerous sound-proofed studios and practice rooms as well as a state-of-the-art piano lab and computer lab. A professional faculty of 17 includes active performers, recitalists, composers, historians, and conductors. Edinboro's Music Department offers Bachelor of Arts degrees in Music and in Music Education. Performances are held either in the recital hall or the acoustically excellent 850-seat auditorium. Edinboro's music library has over 15,000 LP recordings, CDs, DVDs, and videotapes.

The department faculty is active and proud of its role in the preparation of musicians. Almost 70 students presently major in music, with more than 30 pursuing a music minor. The Music Department is fully accredited by the Pennsylvania Department of Education, Middle States Association of Colleges and Schools, and the National Association of Schools of Music.

Peter van den Honert is Director of Choral Activities at Edinboro University, conducting the University Singers and University Chorale. He also teaches choral conducting, and serves as faculty advisor for a student chapter of the American Choral Directors Association. He is also a past member of the ACDA-PA state Board of Directors. He has a special interest in New England folksongs, and has published several choral arrangements of New England folk tunes. Prior to his appointment at Edinboro he held a similar position at Kansas Wesleyan University. He also taught middle and high school vocal/choral music in the suburban Chicago area before returning for his doctorate at the University of Missouri-Kansas City Conservatory of Music. He is listed in *Who's Who Among American Educators*, and received a Pennsylvania Music Educators Association Special Citation for Excellence in Teaching in 2003. He is active as an adjudicator and clinician, and has served as an honor festival guest conductor in several states.

The **University Singers** is the concert choir of Edinboro University, performing a wide range of music from the sixteenth to the twentieth centuries. Membership is by audition, and is open to any interested student on campus, regardless of major. The choir has released four compact discs, and maintains an active performance schedule both on and off campus. A highlight of each year is the annual state concert tour. The University Singers have twice toured overseas as well. The **University Chorale** is a chamber ensemble selected by audition from the University Singers. Its repertoire is wide ranging and eclectic, ranging from madrigals of the sixteenth century to the present day as well as other chamber work including vocal jazz. The Chorale also maintains an active performance schedule on and off campus, both formal and informal.
